AIRPLAY RAF BRIZE NORTON

Airplay is the RAF Benevolent Fund's £24 million support programme for children and young people whose parents are serving in the Royal Air Force. Here at RAF Brize Norton the Airplay youth project run term time and holiday provision for young people aged 8-18 living in Carterton, benefitting not just the families of Service personnel but also the wider community.

The Airplay staff team is led by Hayley, who became Station Youth Worker in October 2014. Airplay currently operates out of the Allandale Youth Centre in the centre of Carterton on Monday and Wednesday evenings, and out of Flat 10, Ely Close on a Thursday evening.

Three weekly sessions include:

Mondays	6-8pm	8-11yrs	Allandale Youth Centre
Wednesdays	6.30-8.30pm	11-13yrs	Allandale Youth Centre
Thursdays	7.30-9.30pm	14+yrs	Flat 10, Ely Close

Over the last year the number of young people attending the three sessions per week has more than doubled. We continue to grow in number and are always on the lookout for anybody who might be interested in volunteering to help!

We work closely with Carterton Town Council and recently received a £500 donation from the Mayor's charities to the Airplay project.

In addition to the term time sessions that are held, Airplay run holiday provision during the school holidays. During the summer, the Airplay team worked in partnership with Carterton Community College to deliver 'Get Stuck In'.

A CENTRE FOR ALL THE COMMUNITY

Carterton Community Centre opened its doors in October 2008. Now well into our seventh year, we are continuing to be seen as a hub of activity within the local area, hosting all kinds of events and providing a fantastic facility for the whole community. We have an excellent choice of rooms available for hire at very affordable prices.

The Community Centre has a Main Hall which seats up to 200 people theatre style (there is a stage, lighting & sound). The Small Hall seats up to 50 theatre style. Further meeting rooms and offices are also available.

We host a variety of events and often work in partnership with local groups. Every year we work alongside The Carterton Lions by hosting their annual art exhibition. As a perfect opportunity for local artists to display their talent, the exhibition is extremely popular and hugely successful.

You can drop in anytime during opening hours, receive expert guidance from our professional artist if needed, and make use of the free materials to create your lanterns.

The café will be open for light refreshments with proceeds going to St John the Evangelist Primary School, Shilton Park, Carterton.

We still have our annual Christmas Craft & Gift Fair to look forward to. This year it will be on Saturday 28 November from 10am-4pm. Over 30 fantastic stalls will be selling beautiful and unique handcrafted items and other Christmas gift ideas. Admission is free and the café will be open. Pick up some great presents in time for Christmas, then relax in the café with a hot drink and something to eat.

GET FIT WITH RESPECT FITNESS MARTIAL ARTS AND PERSONAL TRAINING

Martial artist Steven Clarke and his wife Dawn opened a Kuk Sool Won martial arts academy and a personal training suite on the Ventura Business Park, Carterton in May 2013 to promote a healthy lifestyle for children and adults whilst learning some vital life skills in a family friendly environment.

Steven has been studying martial arts for over 35 years and is a fourth degree black belt in the traditional Korean martial art of Kuk Sool Won, whilst Dawn is a second degree black belt and has been practicing for some 18 years.

We started teaching Kuk Sool Won in Carterton at Edith Moorhouse Primary School back in 2006 where we developed a number of students to enable them to gain their coveted black belt.

On our growth with more martial arts classes as well as offering personal training services we moved to our current location. Edith Moorhouse Primary School had been very supportive of the club and we are continuing our association with them by supporting the school whenever possible.

Our academy also allows the latest venture, Chipmunks, to develop. Chipmunks is predominantly for pre-school children wishing to develop vital motor skills such as balance, coordination, listening, agility and working together.

We encourage parents to stay and watch their children train, that way they can see and understand the

benefits and developments. The adult classes have benefited from parents deciding what's good for their children is good for them.

We are members of the World Kuk Sool Association (WKSA) which regulates the code of conduct and quality control of the martial arts teaching to ensure all members promoted to the black belt level and beyond are of the correct standard.

November this year will see us hosting a WKSA seminar with our Grandmaster and WKSA Senior Masters at our academy. This will be the third consecutive year our academy has been chosen to support the Seminar tour which visits various Kuk Sool Won schools throughout the country.

Raising funds for NPC

.....

Geri Fitzsimons on her nephew's fatal
neuro-degenerative condition and what
can be done to help...



Sam is 8 years old. He loves school, playing football, going on his scooter and running about in the park with his brother, sister and dog. If he had his way he'd have sausages and ice cream every mealtime! When Sam was a baby he was diagnosed with a rare genetic condition called Niemann-Pick Type C. It's a fatal neuro-degenerative condition with no cure. Most children with NPC don't make it to their teens. NPC makes Sam unsteady on his feet, fall often, and makes his speech sometimes difficult to understand. It will eventually confine him to a wheelchair, unable to move, talk or eat.

We are doing everything we can to help Sam now – to make each day filled with love and laughter. And we are working with doctors and scientists to try and get him access to therapy that may slow down the effects of NPC – and maybe just give him enough time until a cure is found.

We then do what we want to do

Wander down Carters Walk and you'll find the Siege – a micro-alehouse that opened on 8 May 2015 (matching the corresponding date in 1429 when the Siege of Orleans ended). It is the creation of local man Chris Jones, who researched the recent trend for micropubs as he sought to bring something new to Carterton. Micropubs have been in existence for about 10 years, the first being The Butchers Arms in Kent, opening for business in 2005. They now number over 100 and cover many areas of the UK. Oxfordshire, however, has seemingly resisted the trend, until now...

The Siege of Orleans seeks to offer something different to local pubs. Phil Lewis runs the bar on a day-to-day basis. "When you go into a pub you know what you want, be it a Guinness or a Stella," Phil says. "When you come through our doors, you look at the pumps and the products behind and think 'I don't recognise anything here.' It's up to us as bar staff then to educate customers

in what the products are and which ones will best suit them, to give them something different and – to use a Peter Kay phrase – 'a taste sensation!'" When the Crier popped into the Siege, Phil talked honestly about the ales, what he didn't like and why (it's always refreshing to hear people avoid the 'I love everything here' route), as well as allowing our reporter a taste before they committed to a larger measure – a pint of Loose Cannon Bandwagon, brewed in Abingdon, was opted for in the end.

Phil also informs of how the Siege refuses to conform to the micropub trend. "To be classed as a micropub you need to be part of the micropub association. There are quite a few rules that they like you to follow – no music, no lager, no spirits, no fruit machines and no televisions...just real ale and the art of conversation. We thought that we'd class ourselves as a micro-alehouse – a normal alehouse but on a smaller scale. And we then do what we want to do."



There's roughly 2000-3000 people who live in Carterton but don't drink in Carterton. If you're in that group, it is this micro-alehouse's aim to get you drinking here again. "We're changing our ales all the time" says Phil. There are so many different ales in circulation; when Phil opens his doors on a Monday morning there'll be three reps outside wanting to sell him their produce. It's not just the beverages that make this place what it is. "It's a nice relaxed atmosphere – it's got a good vibe to it. People like to come in because they can talk; they're not going to have their ears bleeding because of loud music or television; that's not what we're about". However, being a place that is not restricted by certain rules, the Siege still showed the Rugby World Cup this year despite the micropub bible banning television. Further, the bar serves spirits; they are sourced from all around the globe: before Phil spoke to the Crier he

had been on the phone to a supplier in Norway discussing vodka. In essence, this venue is new and quirky but does not go so far as to blacklist typical things that people do like to see in their pubs.

Recently the Siege was gripped with Beer Pong Fever as 32 teams battled to win a 3 night trip to Prague to visit the Royal Krusovice Brewery. There's more coming up, including a charity auction in November, plus Halloween and Christmas parties. The Siege will also be sponsoring Carterton Town Council's Christmas lights switch-on. On the last Sunday of every month, there is a chill-out evening with live music; November will feature James Morgan who recently appeared at Shop Carterton Day putting his own spin on The Fresh Prince of Bel Air and Arthur theme tunes.

So show your face in the Siege. It's here, and your drinking should be too.

A CARTERTON CHARACTER

Ken Southam

Every town and village has its characters – the people that have been integral to the heart and history of wherever it may be.

A Carterton Character is a series of pieces focusing on the memories of a Cartonian; a unique history that will bring a smile to your face.

Sam Bennett visited our first character, Ken Southam, a Carterton resident old enough to have gone to school by donkey cart.



Ken Southam's daughter, Sue, opened the door of his bungalow to me and Lynn Little. "She's always late" Sue said, gesturing towards Lynn. (In the Mayor's defence, she had been spending her day trying to find a place for a homeless war veteran to live.)

Ken was sat waiting in the kitchen. The smell of his pipe lingered and he was quick to warn me of the cabinet positioned just inches above my head. "I'm a bit on the deaf side so shout" he said, just before our interview began. A touch of deafness is quite understandable given the fact he is 95. He came to Carterton when he was 4, and I asked him if the town had changed a lot in that time. He said it had but not for the best, putting this down to there being too much building taking place: "we're going to be in trouble before long up this road". He also doesn't believe the Co-op should have been allowed: "there was plenty of things going on without that. It's what killed the market. One day at the market there were 60 stalls, now they have about three don't they?"

We discussed the first bus service in Carterton. "Frank Jones bought this small bus for schools more than anything. The City of Oxford wanted to start a bus service from Carterton. Carterton people objected; they said: 'No, Mr Jones has got a bus here!' So what used to happen was at the time The City of Oxford bus was due to go, Mr Jones pulled up in his 10 or 12 seater and anybody in Carterton who had a car went with him - like a funeral procession! This went on for about 6 months until the law stepped in!" Transport came up more than once in our conversation. Ken remembers when the Americans were in Carterton. They used to leave their cars behind when they left. "We used to flog them," he said, "anyone would buy them for stock car racing, banger racing". (The

United States Air Force was given the Royal Air Force Brize Norton airfield in 1951. USAF remained in Carterton until 1965 - but kept making bomber detachments here until 1967).

You often hear kids talk about how there's nothing to do in their towns. I wondered if there was anything for the young Ken Southam to do. "The only thing we used to do was put a penny on the railway to see if a train would flatten it!" Ken went to Burford School when it was still a grammar school, and he used to run, once taking part in a schools competition at the White City - "I was unlucky, I was third". He didn't just run competitively. "We had a big fat man who was a policeman here, and he was always chasing us because we were being a bloody nuisance" Ken said. "He used to go out to Alvescot to the pub on his bike. The boys would go down there with a bit of string. When he went in to have a drink they'd tie his pedal to the frame!"

Ken Southam left school at the age of 14. He helped his dad, who owned a builder's yard, do decorating. "Did he give you any money for that?" I asked Ken. "I doubt it" he replied. "I was friendly with the pub landlord's son, Geoff Smith" he went on to say. Geoff was the son of Charles Samuel Smith, who is said to be the first landlord of Carterton's first pub, The Beehive, which opened in 1932. "Geoff used to be on the milk recording. We were often out together and he said 'You ought to get a driver's licence, why don't you come out milk recording with me and learn to drive?' So I used to go out with him driving, I knew all the farms he had to go to. One time the tyre burst when he was asleep - 'Christ, I thought we'd hit something!' he said." It's not all the pair got up to. "Geoff had a sister called Pam who lived with their gran in Essex. He rang me one night and said 'you'll have to pick me up later on.' I said 'why?'

He said 'Pam's getting married tomorrow, we mustn't miss that.' So nine o'clock at night we set off for Essex. When we got there we knocked on the door. 'What the bloody hell are you doing here?' Pam said. 'We've come for the wedding, my duck' Geoff said. 'It ain't half cold, you go get in Gran's bed with her and we'll have yours!'

Ken was in the airforce during the war, looking after Carterton. Asking him about his war experience led to a story about a driver he knew called Ted Bendall. One day the camp was being bombed as Ted drove so he got out and took shelter under his vehicle. When the all-clear was called he told his associates where he had taken cover...only to be told what he was carrying in the lorry was a load of explosives! Another tale involved a soldier providing a specimen as part of his medical and spilling it over the chap examining him!

Ken made himself useful in other ways during the war. "I used to drive for Archie Rose." Rose owned The Vineries which specialised in fruit and veg. "I had my day off on a Friday, so I'd come home on Thursday night, he'd have his van loaded up ready, I'd deliver around Oxford for him - all his tomatoes!" (Carterton's history is very tomato orientated: "everybody in Carterton had chickens and tomatoes" our Carterton character had already informed me).

Police, bombs, tomatoes...I could have talked to Ken for so much longer. But I didn't want to tire him out completely; he had just relayed years and years of Carterton life to me. Many thanks to him for being a fabulous first in what we hope will be a series full of cheer, charm and character!

WEST OXFORDSHIRE POSTCODE AREA NAMED A TOP FAMILY HOTSPOT

The OX18 postcode area in West Oxfordshire has been named as one of the most desirable places in the country to raise a family.

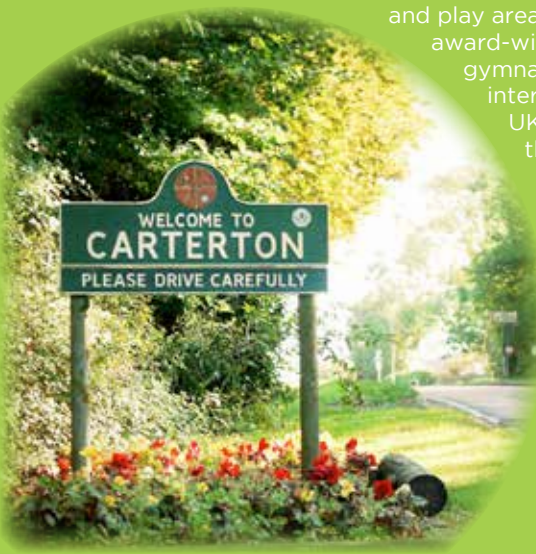
The area encompasses Bampton, Burford, Carterton and a number of villages and smaller settlements.

One Family (www.onefamily.com) is an insurance, investments and savings mutual that produces a report every year listing the best locations in England and Wales for families to live.

The area was ranked 11th following an analysis of nearly 2,400 postcode areas across England and Wales using over 70 different sets of data. The analysis references key criteria important to parents when deciding where to settle and raise their family. It includes education, safety, childcare costs, local amenities, affordable property and green spaces.

As well as excellent local clubs and activities geared to families, the area has a modern Leisure Centre, an attractive country park and play area (Kilkenny Lane Country Park) and an award-winning gymnastics club at Carterton with gymnasts representing the UK in national and international events. It is also home to the UK's only crocodile zoo (Crocodiles of the World) and one of the UK's largest zoological collections at the Cotswold Wildlife Park and Gardens.

Burford is often referred to as the 'Gateway to the Cotswolds' and is one of many picturesque villages in this area. Around 25,000 people live in OX18; the largest town being Carterton with a population of 16,000. The town has more than trebled in size during the last 30 years.

THE LIONS CLUBS OF OXFORDSHIRE MESSAGE IN A BOTTLE SCHEME

The Emergency Information scheme from the Lions Clubs of Oxfordshire

Everyone will be acutely aware of the problems faced by the emergency services when they are called into the home of someone who lives on their own and who has, perhaps, collapsed or been involved in an incident.

- Who is this person?
- What medication are they taking?
- Are they allergic to anything?
- Who is their next of kin (or carer) for us to contact?
- Are there any pets in the house who will need attention if this patient has to be taken into hospital?

This is where the “Message in a Bottle” is invaluable as it is there to help just such people – vulnerable people who are potentially at risk.

The plastic bottle measures approximately 4” high and 2” diameter. Personal information, such as medical conditions, regular medications, allergies, doctor’s details and details of next of kin are written on a form provided and placed inside the bottle. The information inside could obviously prove critical in deciding any appropriate treatment or other necessary action. The bottle is placed in the fridge and a green sticker is placed on the outside door of the fridge. A second sticker is placed on the inside of the main entrance door (so that it is not visible to unwelcome callers) to alert all emergency services to its existence.



The scheme is strongly supported by our local emergency services who are impressed by the simplicity of the system. It is also now a national scheme, run throughout the country by Lions and some other organisations all with the same aim, ensuring that their community is being helped to the maximum. There are now over 81,000 of these little bottles in the fridges of Oxfordshire alone – proving invaluable day by day.

The Lions Clubs are very aware of the fact that this is not a “flash in the pan” – but an on-going commitment to our communities and we have been running this nationally since the year 2002. Our motto is “We Serve” and we therefore tend towards really practical and tangible methods of helping our communities. The Lions are very proud to be running a scheme which will give peace of mind to so many people and their families.

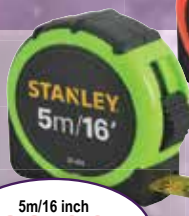

CARTERTON WITH MIKE STEWARD



This is the first **CARTERTON** feature. Each issue we'll bring you something arty and Cartonian. In this first issue, we feature Mike Steward – “an ordinary chap who relaxes with a paintbrush and water.” Carterton has been Mike's home for 30 years; he has painted various parts of it as well as producing the Mayor's Christmas card.

Mike doesn't describe himself as an artist, partly attributing this to his school days, where he was told not to pursue the subject beyond the age of 14. “Whilst I had enjoyed art as a pupil, I was told that I had no future as an artist and did not opt for it at O-level.” Mike became a geography teacher, “many a labelled chalk drawn landscape appeared on my classroom board – only to be eradicated at the end of the lesson. I knew I could draw landscapes.”

Nine years ago he retired from Carterton Community College at the age of 54 to take care of his sick mother. “Retirement saw me signing up for a 10 week evening class at Witney College – ‘Water colour for beginners’. The course was inspirational and I loved the concentration and commitment that 2 hours of sitting in front of paper with paints and brushes gave me.”

There are a fair few painters in Carterton but Mike does not believe this is something unique to the town – “I think if you delve into it, it would be the case in most places. Bampton has got its own little art group, Witney has too, scattered around are many people who pick up a paintbrush and palette and probably haven't got the opportunity to put their work before other people.”



Mike's opportunity came when the Carterton Lions displayed his work in one of their exhibitions, something he regards as a big step in his life. It was a brave move on his part when you consider the nature of the man: "In a way I'm quite shy about it because I don't want to be ridiculed; I'm my biggest critic, I know what's gone wrong in a painting but don't want to hear other people telling me!" All was well with the exhibition, he put 4 paintings on show and remembers looking at them and thinking: "Yeah, I can live with these!" He is able to assess his work quite honestly (his mother didn't do this - "she liked everything I did no matter how bad it was!"), "I've got different paintings on the wall that I've done, and I know why I've got them there. In one of them I think the actual landscape is not very good but the sky is superb".

So what's going on at the moment? Mike's annual holiday to Okehampton is approaching, where he can paint Dartmoor in peace and quiet. Sadly his mother is no longer alive, "it will be strange to not have her loving eye over my next painting". What about the style of any upcoming art? And where can we next see it? "I still stay in the safe zone." He says. "Landscapes dominate my studies although I do enjoy painting flowers from nature or pictures. I do try to paint a picture for every Town Hall charity raffle/auction - it's usually the last to go but at least the frame is worth something!"

Based on his work, this former geography teacher could describe himself as an artist, but perhaps for him to do so would be to damage the idea of a fun hobby - "I never thought of myself as an artist. I just enjoy drawing and painting."

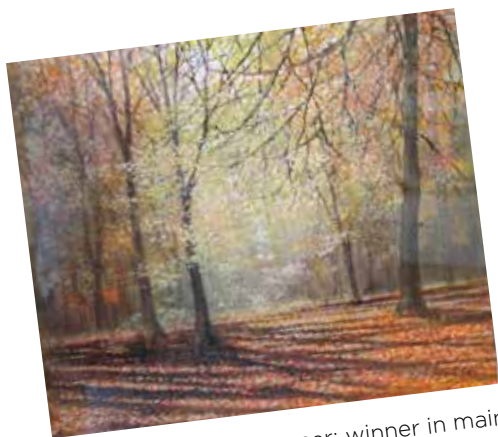

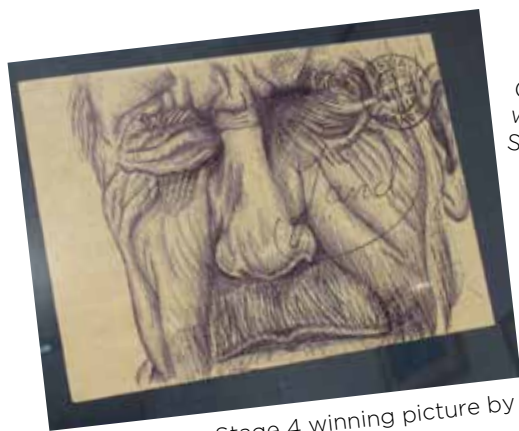

The look I get asked for most often by my Cotswolds clients is 'contemporary country' – and nothing does the job better than natural materials and traditional techniques. Following our successful Ofsted in July 2014, we have continued to see our school go from strength to strength and the number of children on roll increase.

Last year we worked with all children, parents, staff and governors to agree our new mission statement, 'Caring for Others, Achieving Excellence'. Our mission and values of respect, unity, self-belief, success, responsibility and inspiration now underpin all we do across our school community. This term we have been reflecting the meaning of our values through the arts. We are excited to be working with an artist in residence this term to create silk banners for our school corridor.

We are very lucky at St John's to be supported by a wonderful parent body and Home School Association. Last year we raised over £10,000 towards the development of a new school library. As I write, the library is being installed and will soon be a resource for all of our children and families. Our Home School Association plan a range of events over the course of the year. Forthcoming events will include our very popular annual Christmas Fayre.

Again, this demonstrates the usefulness of CCSF as a collaborative body.

This is central to our philosophy at Carterton Community College. We provide our students with continuous everyday excellent opportunities through well qualified and highly committed teachers. Our Challenge Partners report demonstrated how well we are performing as a college. This independent report from external professionals led by a qualified Ofsted inspector was rigorous and challenging but the outcome of “Outstanding” overall showed we are on the right track.



This year at Carterton Community College we have worked hard to market ourselves with our sixth form opening and we are delighted that the response from existing students has been so prolific. We have recruited over 60% of our Year 11 students and with so many wide ranging subjects on offer, we have certainly got a higher number of students than expected in our first year. We are confident that we have the capacity and skillset amongst our dedicated staff and the continued provision of Key Stage 5 lessons will be of high quality next academic year. This year will see our sixth form continuing to thrive and we look for more opportunities to be creative with our curriculum in order to help continue to raise standards. We will be concentrating on what additional support we can provide within the community.

As a college and a federation, we are always looking to improve the outcomes for all youngsters in Carterton and the surrounding villages. We are a true community school and welcome all comments whether supportive or challenging. We actively encourage community events to support all schools. Whenever the situation occurs to compliment us as a school, it is always appreciated and we look forward to engaging community stakeholders in conversation over the next 12 months as the federation of schools continues to expand.

Commitment to an idea

**16 year old Alana Jones, a
Carterton Community College student,
spoke to the Carterton Crier about cutting her
hair for The Little Princess Trust**

Alana Jones went up to her mum one morning before school started and told her she wanted a haircut. "Obviously my mum knows me very well and she knew that I wouldn't go through with it," Alana said. "Because I'm always a person who worries a lot, always thinking 'I can't do it, I can't do it'. She told me I needed a proper reason to commit to it. So she said to have a look online and find a couple of good reasons why I should cut my hair."

Alana plays football for Carterton Town (she spoke to us following a weekend 1-0 win in which she scored the winner). At first she thought of cutting her hair to raise money for the club; but then she decided to prioritise another cause...

The Little Princess Trust is a children's cancer charity and their mission is

to supply real hair wigs to children suffering with cancer, for the duration of their treatment. However, in addition they assist children with other conditions which also result in hair loss, the most common being alopecia. Alana set up a GoFundMe page through which people could sponsor her for the haircut; later her cousin, a hairdresser, took 14 inches off her hair..."I ponytailed it, tied it, put it in a plastic bag and posted it to them. It's been sent off to China to make a wig for a little girl." Alana raised £360 for the trust.

People, whether they're male or female, adults, teenagers or children, can be image conscious. This must have been quite a scary endeavour. "It was nerve-racking. But I've wanted to cut my hair for a year, mainly for practical reasons like football and



having to get up early in the morning to do my hair – it just didn't suit my lifestyle. So I knew I was going to do it. But when it came to it I was shaking!"

Should more people Alana's age do things like this? "I think it's a definite thing we need to encourage." The 16 year old said. "However it's more about personal spirit and it's commitment to an idea that we need to help kids with, especially with things that people are self-conscious of, I know a lot of girls would never do it purely because society wants them to have long hair." Is body image addressed well enough in schools? "Loads of the teachers have been extremely supportive of me and I've had advice from most of them. They're all really friendly at Carterton and you can trust any of the teachers. And I feel like most of the students here believe that as well. A lot of the girls and guys would believe that body image is not important. No-one's made any inappropriate comments

or said anything about my hair being distracting. The teachers have been doing a very good job there."

It doesn't sound like it's the end of Alana's charity work. She is considering growing her hair again which could mean another cut in 2-3 years' time. If this doesn't happen charity runs are in the pipeline, meaning she can use one of her passions, "I've never really thought about life without sport" she says, to help others – she still wants to raise money for Carterton Football Club and generally assist the progression in cancer research. Another idea doesn't involve as much distance as charity runs..."my twin sister and I were thinking about raising more money by doing a baked bean bath; we haven't found an appropriate date to do it yet – maybe one when it's slightly warmer!"

A Green

KEEP YOUR TREE!

I have relatives from Kent who frequently camp in the Cotswolds and come into Carterton for their shopping. They like Carterton and always especially mention the trees lining the streets on all the main roads into the town.

However over the last couple of years the amount of trees being cut down is becoming increasingly worrying. We do not have the resources to fight developers on this issue but would like to persuade our residents to think twice before felling a tree on their property. If you really have no other choice, then plant another more suitable species to replace the tree you have removed.

I live with a large apple tree and 4 Damson trees, already in situ when I moved in. Yes it is inconvenient for a couple of months when the fruit is on the ground, getting trodden under foot and generally looking messy but this mulch also provides a wealth of wildlife with nourishment to sustain them through the winter months. There is another large tree in our garden (species unknown); apart from the amount of birds it offers safety and shelter to, it makes a really good anchor for my hammock! We have some variety of Pine to the side of the house. It sheds its needles everywhere, creating a horrible mess but again is a haven for birds and very nicely blocks out our view of a nearby sub-station. Try to look at the positive reasons for keeping your tree.

There are some very good tree surgeons in the area that can offer advice or undertake work that is not too expensive. One tip I learned from our tree surgeon is if you are having problems with birds sitting in trees near to your property and producing a lot of colourful droppings, which can ruin car paint work and look unsightly, just hang some old CD's amongst the branches of the tree. Even if you have to employ someone with a ladder to do this for you it will still be cheaper than the cost of felling.

There is almost always another solution rather than the final one!

GARDEN WASTE BINS

A REMINDER

It has been brought to the attention of the Town Council that some residents in Carterton are putting household waste and recycling into their garden waste bins.

Please note that these bins should be used for garden greenery and green waste only.

YES PLEASE:

- Hay/straw animal bedding from non-meat-eating animals
- Flowers and leaves
- Grass cuttings
- Bark and wood shavings
- Twigs, branches and small logs (maximum 150mm or 6 inches diameter)
- Small quantities of soil



NO THANK YOU:

- General household rubbish
- Bagged up garden waste (please put garden waste directly in your bin)
- Compost bags
- Plant pots
- Noxious weeds such as Japanese Knotweed or Ragwort
- Large items of garden waste (eg tree trunks)
- Anything plastic
- Glass and metal
- Stone and rubble
- Large quantities of soil
- Nappies
- Dog/cat waste

Your garden waste is taken to a facility near Chipping Norton where it is composted. Having to remove non-compostable items causes serious operational issues and an increase in costs. Please remember that the garden waste service is currently free to all households.

West Oxfordshire District Council will be carrying out spot checks of garden waste bins in the following weeks and any containing non-green waste will not be emptied.

NEW WASTE AND RECYCLING CALENDARS NOW ONLINE

West Oxfordshire residents can now download their waste and recycling calendars for the next 12 months from: **www.westoxon.gov.uk**

Those who live in the area can simply enter their address in the 'postcode search' section on the West Oxfordshire District Council website to access their bin collection calendar.

Here people can also register for handy weekly email alerts about waste collection dates, including a reminder the day before about which bins to put out and helpful information about changes to collection days over the Christmas period and bank holidays.

Cllr David Harvey, District Council Cabinet Member for Environment, said: "We recycle a lot of materials in West Oxfordshire. The calendar is an aide memoire that could go on your fridge door or noticeboard to help remind you what goes in each bin as well as when to put them out for collection.

"Many residents are already taking advantage of our free email reminders with over 5,500 households registered for our alerts service. It's easy to sign up and you can sit back knowing you'll get a reminder straight to your inbox before your next collection."

Paper copies of the waste calendars are available for those that do not have web access. These can be picked up from:

- The District Council's Town Centre Shop and Elmfield offices in Witney
- The Guildhall, Chipping Norton
- Burford Visitor Information Centre
- Carterton Town Hall

As well as bin collection information, residents can use the alerts service to receive information about planning applications registered near to their homes.

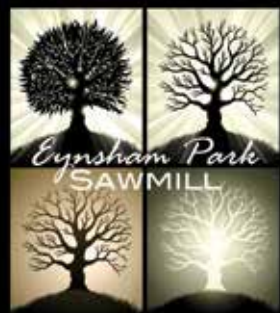

A CARTERTON GREAT MAX SPARKS

A Carterton Great is a series of features about remarkable Carterton figures. This first piece is about Max Sparks, the last surviving pilot of a low-level World War 2 bombing mission.

Max was a resident of Carterton and originally from Carterton, New Zealand! He died in 2013 at the age of 92. This is the story of his involvement in the raid on Amiens Prison known as Operation Jericho.

On Friday 18 February 1944, as the time approached 11am, aircraft carrying out a raid on Amiens Prison took off from a Hertfordshire airfield – 19 Mosquito Mk.VI aircraft: 6 aircraft of No. 487 (Royal New Zealand Air Force) Squadron, 6 of No. 464 (Royal Australian Air Force), 6 of No. 21 and one Photographic Reconnaissance Unit (PRU) aircraft. This was Operation Jericho.

There is question as to what this mission was in aid of. Did the French Resistance ask MI6 for the raid in order to release résistants imprisoned at Amiens? Or was it all part of a plot to convince the Germans that when the invasion of France came it would be in the Pas-de-Calais? In *The Jail Busters* Michael Lyman describes it as “an unashamedly heroic rescue story: of

résistants (and possibly British agents also) incarcerated in the jail awaiting certain death or deportation to a concentration camp in the east (which meant the same thing)”.

No matter what the reason for the attack was, Max Sparks was the second pilot to take off, as part of the first wave of 6 aircraft (belonging to the RNZAF) due to strike at 12 noon – as the German guards inside took their lunch. The job of this first wave was to break down the eastern wall of the target with their bombs – and to bomb the northern wall and the guard’s quarters. All this was to come after flying at a very low level across the channel in horrible weather.

Sparks’ goal was to strike the eastern wall. He would have released his bombs once his group leader, Charles Pickard, had dropped his. Once this had been done, there was no time to assess what had happened; he and his navigator Arthur Dunlop had to leave for home. They were struck by German flak on one of the wings and returned to base in a written off aircraft. Pickard and his navigator Bill Broadley were not so lucky: their aircraft was shot down by Focke-Wulf 190s, killing them both.

Forty bombs were dropped in total. Enough of these were on target for the 3rd wave of aircraft – on standby – to not be called in. Both ends of the prison and the guard's quarters were successfully hit, and Governor Eugene Schwarzenholzer was apparently decapitated in the process. Reportedly 712 people were incarcerated in Amiens Prison, 190 of which were résistants. Taking recapture, injury and death into account, Michael Lyman estimates that “around 84 résistants would have secured their liberty on that momentous day”.

Max took a huge risk to save the lives of many others, but when he died so few were at the service commemorating his. There are no family back home in New Zealand and his daughter tragically died from a blood clot when she was in Cyprus. He is survived only by his wife; ill in a nursing home, she does not even know he is dead. So we see it as right to offer a form of tribute to Max Sparks: our first Carterton Great.

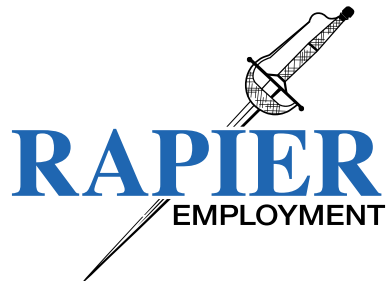

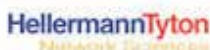
